Clinton: Waves of Praise From Oceans Campaign

IN THE WAKE OF THE SEPTEMBER 11 ATTACKS, AMERIcan Oceans Campaign founder Ted Danson offered to cancel the organization's October 2 dinner in Los Angeles honoring Bill Clinton for his commitment to environmental issues. But the former president insisted that the event continue, despite his uneasiness about accepting awards. "It's an eerie feeling," said Clinton. "Like they're trying to shovel up the dirt on your grave before it's time." After noodling on the saxophone backstage, Clinton mingled with Leonardo DiCaprio, Danny DeVito and his wife, Rhea Perlman, and Danson's wife, Mary Steenburgen, whom he called "the first person outside my [immediate] family who actually thought I could be elected president." A few days earlier, Clinton had been in England helping his daughter, Chelsea, move into her dormitory at the University of Oxford, her father's alma mater, where she will spend the next two years earning her master's degree in international relations. 






J. Lo and Cris Judd Honeymoon Italian-Style
